*Said Conrad Cornelius O'Donell O'Dell  
My very young friend who is learning to spell  
The A is for ape, the B is for bear,  
The C is for camel, the H is for hare  
The M is for mouse, the R is for rat I know all 26 letters like that  
Through to Z is for zebra, I know them all well  
Said Conrad Cornelius O'Donell O'Dell*

*Now I know everything anyone knows  
From beginning to end, from the start to the close  
Because Z is as far as the alphabet goes  
Then he almost fell flat on his face on the floor  
When I picked up the chalk and drew one letter more  
A letter he had never dreamed of before*

*And I said 'You can stop if you want with the Z  
Most people stop with the Z, but not me  
In the places I go there are things that I see  
That I never can spell if I stop with a Z  
I'm telling you this 'cos you're one of my friends  
My alphabet starts where your alphabet ends  
My alphabet starts with this letter called YUZ  
It's the letter I use to spell yuzza ma tuzz  
You'll be sort of surprised what there is to be found  
Once you go beyond Z and start poking around  
So on beyond zebra explore like Columbus .....*



This may be a simple quote from a children's book, but it holds a profound message for those who are trying to find a better way. If we stop the thought process where tradition has told us it ends, we will seldom make great advances in improvement. To consistently move forward, we must occasionally contemplate: What is after Z for Zebra?
