PROJECT OVERVIEW

Northwestern Mutual is developing a campus in Franklin, Wis., to accommodate their expanding needs over the next 10-20 years. Work was completed in April 2004 on the two-year, \$125 million first phase of the project, a half-million square foot low-rise office building.

SITUATION

Grunau Metals helped Northwestern Mutual maintain the architectural quality of their building with its keen sense of style and attention to the smallest details. The metals team fabricated the building's ornamental stainless steel railings, and when the general contractor requested a

minimum amount of visible welds, they devised an innovative fastening system with unexposed fasteners. Details such as the distinct linear polish on the stainless steel components, rather than the traditional polish around the metal's circumference, gave the metal a high-end look. Grunau Metals conveyed their attention to detail while managing the contractors who installed the wood cap and glass infill for the railings. The metals team also installed the galvanized grilles in the building's parking structure, exhibiting their wide range of metal fabrication skills.
